



commandments or the feasts of YHWH or the judgments, then that person forfeits his salvation in the Greek/Roman Christ. That person is now trusting in their ability to keep the commandments, the feasts of YHWH, and the judgments to save themselves outside of the Greek/Roman Christ. According to them, that person is trying to be legalistic “*nomos, with law.*” Of course, no Christian wants to be legalistic, “*nomos, with law,*” and in Covenant with YHWH through the Hebrew Messiah. Therefore, it is actually interesting that Christians use that word, “legalistic” “*nomos, with law*” for those who are literally keeping the Words of YHWH in the Covenant of YHWSHI/Yeshua. Because the Greek/Roman Church system does not keep the Covenant of YHWH through the Hebrew Messiah YHWSHI/Yeshua, the Church would actually be illegal or rather “*anomia, without law.*”

Now let's look at this claim, "The Law Was Nailed To The Cross." First off, it was a tree, and second, according to their interpretation, they should correctly be saying, "The Old Testament Was Nailed To The Cross!" Let's examine this claim and its implications.

The definition of Sin is "missing the mark." So what defines what “missing the mark” is? For "sin" to be correctly defined as "sin," parameters are required to legally define what the act(s) of "sin" is/are. There must be a legal definition that can be employed to define what an act of Sin is. Why is that?

Let's say that the Law, in its entirety, was, in fact, nailed to the cross and made of no effect. Knowing that the Law defines what Sin is. If this was actually true, there would be no definition of what Sin is if there is truly no law.

If there is no definition of what Sin is, then there can be no sin. If there is no sin, or if Sin cannot be defined, then Sin becomes inconsequential. Sin would no longer exist because it would have no legal definition. If there was no legal definition of Sin, then there could not be legal proceedings to convict someone of Sin. So, that would make the Great White Throne judgment, in the book of Revelation, a kangaroo court judgment. Sin could no longer be defined and can no longer be a valid reason for prosecution or punishment.

There would no longer be a need for moral uprightness. We could all come together on Sundays like all Christians do and celebrate the removal of a moral standard, the Covenant of YHWH. There would be no legal authority for YHWH to call out a specific group of people to call his own. The entire world would have to be allowed into the Kingdom of Heaven because there is no definition of Sin. Everyone who has lived would be required to be redeemed into eternal grace.

YHWH would have to apologize to man for everything that He has done to them in the name of righteousness. The death of Yeshua would have been for no reason other than to cancel the Law that defines what Sin is.

If Sin is no longer defined, then there no longer has to be any moral fortitude, kind of like what we have today in 2021. Without the Law to define Sin, how would anyone know if they were

sinning or not. Doing away with the Law would also prohibit YHWH from "discriminating" against anyone committing an undefined act against him. It would be relegated to simply hurting his feelings if that.

If this were all true, this begs the question, why would we need The Messiah YHWSH/ Yeshua anymore? What use does the Church have any longer? Why would there be any purpose for preachers? I mean, suddenly, there should be no more sin, no right, no wrong. Everyone can just do and say whatever they want as long as they don't hurt each other's feelings.

Your feelings now become the standard of offending someone. Actually, that is what has happened across America. "Feelings!" You hurt my feelings; therefore, we need to make a law, so you don't do that again. I feel like the opposite sex today, so let's make a law that forces people who don't agree with me to accept that. So you don't want to do what your government says, well, let's make a law about that.

According to this standard, it's ok to curse YHWH, steal cars and money, and jewelry. We can all just go out and rape anyone we wish on the street with impunity.

If the Law was done away with, then we have no moral standard by which we can all exist in a society, let alone individually. But even more importantly, in that situation, what do you say to your children? How is this "anomia, lawlessness" way of thinking going to affect them?

Why would we need preachers if this were true? Why are you going to Church? What is the moral standard without the Law? Let me give you a hint: If this was true and the Law has been done away with, then the only reason that the churches and preachers exist would be so that they can tell you what *THEIR DEFINITION OF MORAL UPRIGHTNESS IS!* Think about what I just said. Chew on this for a minute. Everyone should understand what was just said. They are teaching their doctrines, their beliefs, and not the words of YHWH! If there was no law, then why would anyone listen to what they are saying? Anything coming out of their mouths would be relegated to a simple opinion, not a fact, much less a law.

Suppose the Law was actually done away with. In that case, there is absolutely no need for churches, religion, and especially preachers, pastors, and ministers. By making the claim that the Law has been done away with, they have unwittingly set up a trap for themselves to relatively rational people who can actually think logically that they (preachers) have become ensnared and have no way out. It is as if they are looking down the barrel of a loaded shotgun with someone else's finger on the trigger, and they aren't even smart enough to see their own logic. These teachers are dead men walking because they have negated the words of The Most High and are not in Covenant. They teach others to ignore the words of The Most High. They are making the case every week that there is no need for them because, without the Law, there is no sin. Therefore, if that is true, we do not have any use for preachers and churches. We can just do whatever we want to do, and we will end up in Heaven anyway.

Again. let's say, for the sake of argument, that Christians are correct. "The Law" was nailed to the cross. One other thing that we need to do is define what Law are they addressing? There are seventeen Laws that Paul addresses in his writings. Christianity teaches that the whole Law was eliminated, made of no effect, the entire "Old Testament."

Let's take a look at some of the Laws that exist in the Old Testament (Tanakh) and see what Laws there were and whether perhaps that Law that was done away with was one or more of them. There are numerous laws in the Old Testament (Tanakh). Exactly which Law (s) was/were done away with? Was it the marriage laws, civil laws, eating laws, the Law of Moses, the Law of Yahawah, the Law of conscience, the Law of works, the Law of the spirit of life and the Law of Sin and death, the commandments, the Law of faith, the Law of righteousness, the Law of love, the royal Law, the sacrificial Law or a few more laws or maybe even covenants which are entirely different than laws that are all contained just in the first five books of the Tanakh, the Torah.

The Tanakh is divided into 3 very different portions, The Torah, the first five books, The Prophets, and The Writings. Which "Law" is the Christian Church talking about? What part or parts of the Tanakh are included with the Christian definition of "Law"? It isn't logical to say the whole of the Tanakh. That would include the books of historical documents and the books of wisdom and praise. Should we negate those writings as well? If so, there isn't much left.

If your pastor cannot define which Law has been nailed to the cross, you might pack up and get out from under their instruction. They are supposed to know this stuff. This is basic 101.

If your pastor says that the whole Law, "The Old Testament" in its entirety, is null and void because of his sacrifice, again, get out of that Church.

The only Law that was "nailed to the tree" was the Book of the Law. It was added because of trespasses which included the sacrificial ceremonies! One needs to examine what the Book of the Law consists of to determine what Paul was referring to. The ten commandments are not only a part of the Book of The Law, but they are an integral part of the Book of The Covenant.

The Book of The Covenant came before the Book of The Law. The new Covenant that Yeshua cut in his blood for His people mimics the old Book of the Covenant. The exact same words, so, therefore, the ten commandments as originally written in Exodus 20 are now to be written on the hearts of His people and complied with by His people. This is what Paul was talking about. The physical temple was destroyed forty years after Yeshua's resurrection. His blood was the final sacrifice for his people, the called-out ones, the lost sheep of Israel! He was the fulfillment of the Torah.

The Book of the Law, contained in the Torah, was added because of the transgressions of YHWH's bride. Not only were the ten words of YHWH contained within the Book of The Law,

but the same ten words were included in the Covenant as well. The Covenant and the Book of The Law are entirely independent of each other. Both are in the Torah.

The commandments were in both the Covenant as an agreement, before it was broken by the golden calf incident, and later as a mandate, because of transgressions against the Covenant, the golden calf incident. Again, The Book of The Law was added because of transgressions. The Book of The Law was added as a witness against Israel for her transgressions. The Book of The Law was an act of mercy upon the Israelites to avoid killing them for their transgression. I repeat myself over and over in different ways so that you will remember.

As part of the Law, the commandments were now required to keep the Israelites from literally being wiped out by YHWH in his anger because of their disobedience.

His commandments are a voluntary list of things that his people agree to keep on their own and as a group to honor YHWH (אֱלֹהִים)! His people keep his commandments because they chose to keep them, and his commandments keep them. Out of obedience, we show our love, and because we keep his commandments, it proves our love for Him! YHWSH/ Yeshua said that if you love the Father, keep his commandments! If you love me, keep my commandments. If we fail to keep His commandments, we do not love him, and if we do not love him, then we cannot belong to him, and Yahawah is not and cannot live in those who do not love him for they are full of darkness.

Revelation 22: 14

*Blessed are they who **keep**, (DO,) his commandments, that they may have the right to the tree of life, Yahawashi, Torah, and may enter in through the gates into the city.*

John 14:23

*Yahawashi answered and said unto him, If a man loves me, he will **keep**, (DO,) my words, Torah, commandments, instructions: and my Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him.*

Deuteronomy 28:1(to the Nation collectively, available to any nation that exists)

*And it shall come to pass if thou shalt hearken diligently unto the voice, Torah, of Yahawah thy Elohim, to **observe and to do** all his commandments which I command thee this day, that Yahawah thy Elohim will set thee on high above all nations of the earth.*

James 1:22

*But be ye **doers** of the Word, Torah, instructions, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves.*

Proverbs 10:17

*He is in the way of life that **keepeth** instruction, Torah: but he that refuses Torah reproof errs.*

1John 3: 21-22

*Beloved, if our heart condemns us not, then have we confidence toward God. And whatsoever we ask, we receive of him because we **keep** his commandments, Torah, and **do** those things that are pleasing in his sight.*

Romans 5:19

*For as by one man's disobedience (Adam) many were made sinners, so by the **obedience** of one, (Yahawashi), keeping Torah, shall many be made righteous.*

1 Kings 2:3

*And keep the charge of the Yahawah thy Elohim, to **walk (do)** in his ways, to **keep** his statutes, and his commandments, and his judgments, and his testimonies, as it is written in the Law of Moses, TORAH, that thou mayest prosper in all that thou **doest**, and whithersoever thou turnest thyself.*

James 4:7

*Submit yourselves therefore to Yahawah, **submit to his instructions**, Torah. Resist the devil (your evil desires of self-determination), and he (the desire, this a Hebrew reference that is singular masculine, not a separate persona) will flee from you.*

NOTE: In Hebraic culture, the act of "hearing" also means to act on what is heard (to do). Suppose one does not perform or follow through with something that is heard. In that case, he is said to be deaf or not able to hear or, in most cases, be in rebellion to that which was physically heard or perceived.

Malachi 2:2

*If ye will not **hear, do, and if ye will not lay it to heart, to strongly desire something, to give glory unto my name, speaking, professing his name from your lips**, saith Yahawah of hosts, I will even send a curse upon you, and I will curse your blessings: yea, I have cursed them already, because ye do not lay it to heart, you did not desire my instructions or whatever was spoken by Yahawah.*

The Torah is a human being instruction manual. He gave us all of his instructions on how we are to raise our children, how we are to behave, how we are to eat to maintain optimum health and not defile our physical bodies (temples made without hands) to keep diseases at bay and to allow him to reside inside of us. His Torah teaches us how we are to love each other and how we are to approach him. How to obtain everlasting life without being consumed in his presence. It's incredible what he has done for us. Why anyone would reject His Torah is beyond any logic.

Christians and many other religions have outright rejected his Torah (instruction manual) and live their lives according to their own traditions and selfish desires, hopes, and dreams, not His! They are disobedient to him. YHWSHl/Yeshua said, "those who do not keep the commandments of my Father hate him." If you honestly think that his commandments are no longer valid and

you do not keep them, YHWSHl/Yeshua says you hate YHWH. This is from his own mouth. YHWSHl/Yeshua is your witness. The very words that you just read will be your final judge if you reject His Torah, instructions, commandments, covenant. Now you have been told and warned.

The Torah is a powerful weapon. The Torah can bring down strongholds, it is a mighty fortress, yet it is as gentle as a dove. The fact is, when you read the Brit Ha-dash-a, (New Testament), the original words for light, word, truth is synonymous with the word TORAH, instructions!

Be forewarned, the ONLY Law that was "nailed to the cross," as they say, was the Book of the Law! None other! This Book of The Law has everything to do with all of the animal sacrifices of the now-defunct Levitical Priesthood. The Book of The Law is what was done away with, not the Torah.

The ten words of YHWH at Exodus 20:1-17 and the feasts and judgments still stand today in covenant with YHWSHl/Yeshua! You have been lied to, and this lie will cost you your soul if you do nothing! The misunderstanding of the words of Paul will keep you from entering into the rest of YHWH. If you don't keep the commandments of YHWH, then according to YHWSHl/Yeshua, you hate the Father, and you will be rejected. I didn't say it. YHWSHl/Yeshua said it over and over and over. Keeping his ten words and keeping the testimony, (living the example), of YHWSHl/Yeshua is the only way into the Kingdom of YHWH/Heaven.

Now you know, now you have been told and now you have to do something with this knowledge. You can ignore it, or you can share it. If you reject this information, you will be tried and convicted on the last day, and you are now, without excuse.
